Course Information

- 1. School visits: 6 hours a week on days planned with your mentor teacher. You are required to attend school visits weekly and regularly for at least 6 class hours and for 12 weeks by adhering to the rules of the school you are attending. School visits start by the last week of February.
- 2. Virtual exchange: One-hour meeting for a period of 7 weeks in the second half of the semester. Please check LMS for a detailed information about the meeting contents.
- 3. Post-observation meetings with the lecturer: Attend a post-observation feedback and reflection meeting with the course lecturer after practice teaching.

Course Description

This practicum course is designed for English language teacher candidates to engage in teaching, observation, and reflection in a way that broadens their teaching experience and contributes to community service. Students will engage in focused observation of teachers of English to English language learners in Turkish schools. Students will manage their activities and provide documentation of their teaching activities, as well as complete observations and organize materials.

This course is A-F graded and is worth 5 Credits / 10 ECTS.

Course Learning Outcomes/ Objectives

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

- Observe other English language teachers at selected schools in Ankara and their pedagogical practices.
- Identify a central focus/theme and reflect upon these observations guided by the course instructor's focus and how that theme impacts English language acquisition and pedagogy.
- Develop a statement of teaching philosophy, to articulate their view on teaching and assist in professional preparation.
- Develop their capacities to interact with their supervisor, classroom peers, future colleagues, and students to increase the possibility of a positive, enriching, valuable teacher training experience.
- Develop themselves professionally to the greatest possible degree through classroom presentations, class participation, and development of their creative and critical competence.
- Move from the realm of students into the realm of beginning professionals, with a sense of the contribution of their services to learners and to the profession as a whole.
- Experience the integration of digital technologies into classroom teaching, materials design, and use of digital technologies while building their practicum e-portfolios.

Course Requirements and Assessment Tools

Detailed task guidelines and rubrics will be provided throughout the semester before each assignment. For all written assignments, critical thinking, originality, completeness, organization, and using good command of academic language are expected. The following assignments will help you demonstrate your achievement of the learning objectives for this course:
