The course aims to provide the practice of a multi-dimensional architectural and urban design problem that incorporates the contextual, diagrammatic, infrastructural, programmatic and technical complexities. It aims to develop comprehensive architectural design and research processes through integration of contemporary architectural and urban design theories, methods, and techniques.
